Information About Voting for People with Developmental Disabilities, their Families and Staff

Voting in our national, state and local elections is the civil right of every citizen, including people with disabilities.

OPWDD supports everyone's right to vote.

If you need help to vote, talk with the people who support you early so the help you need will be there when you need it. Care Managers and provider agency staff are ready to help you. Accessible voting equipment is available at all polling places.

Make a Plan.

Voting requires some planning. You can vote early at any early voting location in your county, except in New York City where voters are assigned by address to one early voting site.

The Self-Advocacy Association of NYS has created "My Plan to Vote" which will help you get ready to vote. It will walk you through the things you need to think about and do before election day arrives.

Cast Your Vote!

Follow your plan and enjoy exercising your right to vote. Celebrate taking part in our democracy. Be proud that YOU made it happen.

Dates to Remember

The deadline for registering to vote is **October 26, 2024.**

Early voting runs from **October 26th – November 3rd**

Election Day is **November 5, 2024.**
